Victorian Country Championship

 Alistair Anderson

The 14th Victorian Country Championship was held in Maryborough late last year and attracted 28 players. Stewart Booth (seeded 1) has won the event 8 times altogether since 1980 - 5 times outright in 1981, 82, 88, 89 and 90, and he shared the title 3 times in 1987, 91 and 92. He was again the favourite.

Round one saw a unique occurrence with the 14 higher seeds all recording victories over the bottom half, although Liam Ryan (16) played well and was unlucky not to draw against Anderson (2) after four hours play, the longest game of the event.

In round two, Alex Davies (4) showed impressive form as White against Peter Mittel's (11) Sicilian Dragon with a pressurised attack that penetrated Black's defences, while fellow Bendigonian Leigh

Healey (6) suffered the only upset by going down to Andy Mittel (13) after a lengthy tussle. Leading scores - Booth, Anderson, Bas Van Riel (3), Davies, Kevin Perrin (5), Patrick Cook (7), A Mittel 2.

With some brilliant positional moves, Davies scored the big surprise in round three by defeating Booth, which was the first time since 1987 that he had actually lost a game in this event.



Van Riel was held to a draw by another Ballaratian in Cook, and Ryan played a fine game to defeat Healey and now shared the lead in the Reserve section with Bill Tucker (18) who recorded a win over Nigel Barrow (10).

Round four saw the Scotch Opening between Anderson and Davies and an interesting game developed until the latter, in desperate trouble on the clock, lost on time with four moves remaining in a double-edged position. A continual shuffle of Knights and Bishops by Booth and Van Riel resulted in a draw, allowing Cook to move into second place by winning the exchange and beating Perrin. with knights and pawns each the Gibbs brothers could have agreed a draw but (no brotherly love here!) the game went to the wire with Alistair emerging victorious. Ryan continued to take out the higher seeds, this time accounting for Peter Mittel, Dekker triumphed by overcoming Garrow, and junior Chris Barlow (22) drew with Ken Czuczman (17). Leading scores Anderson 4; Cook 3.5; Van Riel, Davies, G Males, A Gibbs, Ryan, Dekker 3.

In round five, a short 14 move draw gave Anderson the title with 4.5, and secured Cook on 4, also unbeaten, who had an excellent tournament, a share of second place. Van Riel finally ground down Gibbs after tenacious resistance to finish equal second, and Davies and G Males (whose only loss was to the winner) defeated Ryan

and Dekker respectively to complete the runner-up quartet. Ryan and Dekker took equal first in the Reserve section with 3. Jeff Males (23) who would have won an award for most pies consumed on a weekend, was coming off a draw and finished on a (and with a) roll with a win over Andy Copeland (25). Stewart, Barlow and Simon Milton (28) all scored 1.5 to share the Junior prize.
